

Winter 2020 Provincial Report Prince Edward Island



Introduction

MQO Research spoke with 400 residents of Prince Edward Island to gauge the political temperature in the province for the Winter edition of our quarterly political poll: Atlantic Matters.

Provincial Politics

According to the latest polling numbers, the PCs extended their lead at the expense of the Green Party. Among decided and leaning voters:

- Support for the PC Party held relatively steady at 41%.
- Support for the Green Party slipped 5 percentage points to 29%.
- Support for the Liberal Party was relatively unchanged at 24%.
- NDP support edged up 4 percentage points to 6%.

The Atlantic Matters poll was conducted by telephone from March 3rd to March 10th, 2020 and included 400 randomly selected eligible voters from across the province. The margin of error for the total sample is ± 4.9 percentage points 19 times out of 20.

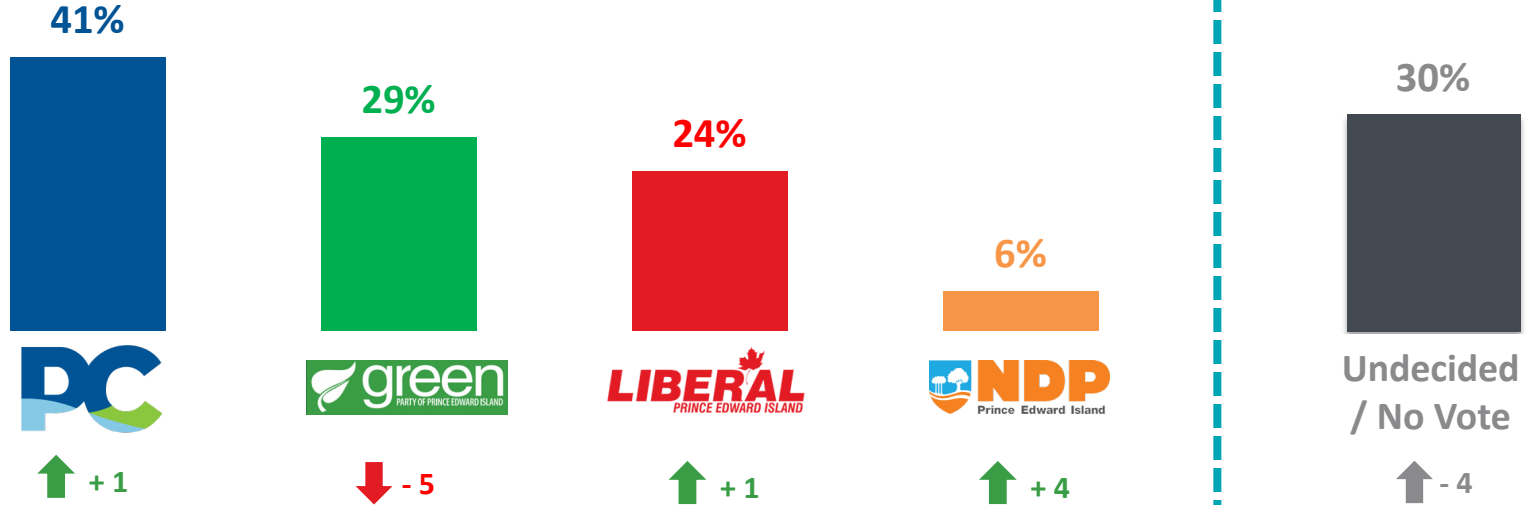
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“If a provincial election were held today, which party would you most likely vote for?”

Decided and Leaning Voters

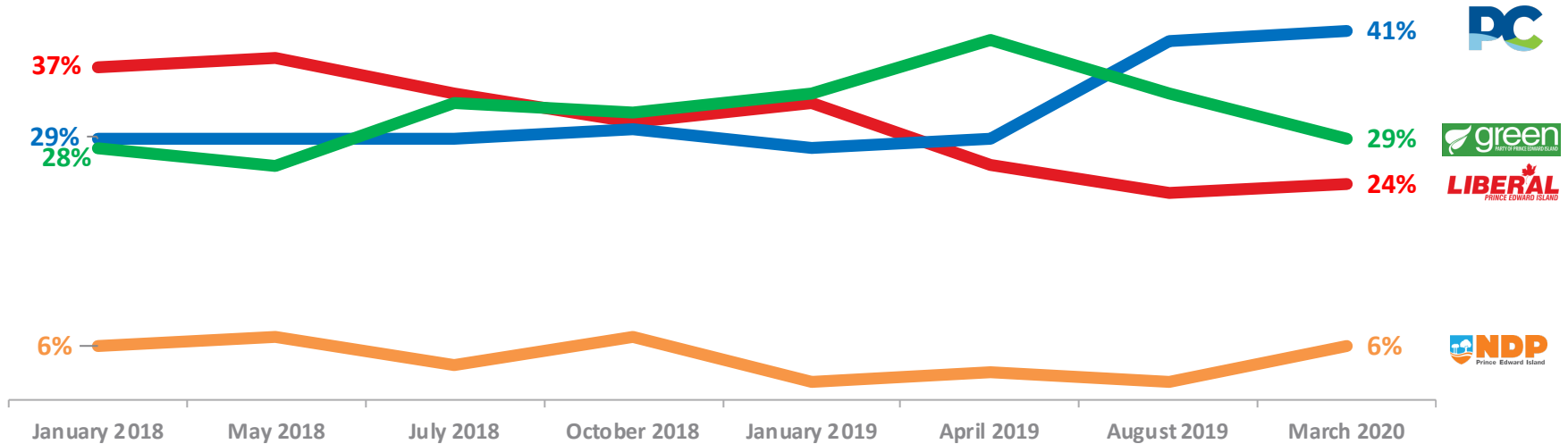


% point change vs. August 2019
